Current activities of OP

1. Feeding the hungry

The main focus of OP'S activities remains feeding the hungry.

In 2018, we initiated a program of providing dry rations every 4 weeks to destitute elderly people, a group that has little means of support beyond a measly pittance issued by the GoSL, being infirm and bereft of family support.

We provided bags of dry rations, consisting of rice, wheat flour, dhal and sugar every 4 weeks to around 500 carefully chosen elders in villages in the Vanni and parts of Jaffna. The chosen villages included Udayarkattu, Mallavi, Vadakampirai, Kilinochchi and Tellipalai. This program proved to be a huge success and OP expanded the program to cover the eastern province in Kiran and Vavunathivu.

OP has since then also spread out to extend a helping hand to upcountry areas in Nanu Oya and Belihul Oya.

In 2022, OP has increased the number of elderly people helped by it from 700 in 2021 to over 1300, incorporating new areas like Mannar and Vavuniya North in the north, 2 centres in Vaakarai in the east and 2 new centres in Haldumulla.

In the prevailing economic situation in Sri Lanka, OP's assistance has been a great help to the elderly.

2. Food supplements to underweight children

OP continues to support malnourished children by funding the provision of **saththu maa**, a nutritious food supplement to the neediest children.

Initially OP was involved in helping preschool children in the Kayts MOH area. However, we received many more requests for help from other areas, like Chankanai, Chavakachcheri, Karavetti, and the number of preschool children supported by OP has increased from around 500 to 1000 over the course of this year.

3. Construction of wells in Vanni

OP has been involved in the provision of safe water for domestic use and home cultivation by constructing wells, conventional dug wells as well as tube wells, in the Vanni area from 2015.

Latterly, OP has worked alongside Well Being, another charity working in the north. So far, 187 wells have been constructed (169 open wells and 18 tube wells). In 2022, 28 open wells were constructed.

The cost of construction of these wells has gone up threefold this year because of the high prices of cement and sand.

The recipients of these wells have made good use of the water from the wells not only for domestic use, but also for home gardening – *veettu thottam.*

4. Education

OP has helped in several ways with improving educational opportunities in SL. We have continued to work with E Kalvi, the Melbourne based charity, in the provision of pendrives and Smart classrooms.

OP has also helped Winrose Academy in Haputale to meet diverse needs.

OP Education is headed by Mr. Skandakumar, the Chair of OP Sri Lanka, and supported by Prof. Swaminathan and Dr. Ambihapathy, who are trustees of OP UK.

OP's response to times of crisis in Sri Lanka

Hospitals and medicines

OP has clear objectives to which it adheres in undertaking projects. However, we have been responsive to appeals in times of crisis.

In 2021, OP helped hospitals in Jaffna, Batticaloa and Haputale, to cope with the Covid19 outbreak by providing medical equipment like Oxygen concentrators and pulse oximeters at short notice.

In 2022, a major shortage of medical drugs occurred due to a serious lack of foreign exchange for importing medicines. Responding to an urgent appeal from the Director of the Jaffna Hospital and The Provincial Director, OP donated £10,000 which was utilised to purchase medicines and equipment and send them to Jaffna, and later to Batticaloa.

Two other fund raising appeals, led by Sir Prof Sabaratnam Arulkumaran, as well as Dr.Subodhini Balasingham of Sacramento Thamil Mandram, raised similar sums of money, both of which were channeled through OP to purchase drugs and equipment, which were then delivered to hospitals in Jaffna and Batticaloa.

The report of this project is encapsulated in the letter of thanks written to the donors by Mr.Skandakumar, which is given below:

Community Kitchens - Feeding the Hungry

SL was in dire economic straits in 2022, with diminishing foreign exchange reserves, fuel shortages and rampant inflation, all of which affected the country in multiple ways. Large numbers of people were made redundant, and poverty levels at their worst in recent history.

In June 2022, OP initiated Community kitchens in four villages in Jaffna – Sooriyawathai, Kalvilan, Kaddupulam, and Atchelu.

These Community Kitchens were organized in temple premises, and all were welcome irrespective of their religion and over 1300 people attended these annathanams (rice meals) which were held every Tuesday and Friday until December 2022.

The residents of these 4 villages were highly appreciative of these annathanams which proved to be a lifeline in their difficult situation.
